Dear brothers and sisters, who work with us in this ministry that God has blessed us with here in Honduras, it is a pleasure to share with you again!

Our activities in Balibrea have continued as normal, the church is doing great!! Each Tuesday we have our meeting for people of all ages, and each Thursday we have Bibles studies, both for men and women. Soon we will begin our Sunday school classes for which I ask much prayer.

Speaking of the church, and as we have begun our ministry this year, I want to share a story with you that I hope will impact your lives as it has ours. As we began the activities of the year, together with the church, we asked the members of the church of Balibrea to begin the year with 15 days of prayer, and the last two days to fast as well as pray. The adults of the church thought it was a good idea and asked me to teach on Biblical fasting. At the end of the service a nine year old boy named Noel approached me. He said to me, "Pastor, can you explain fasting to me?" I wondered how I would explain fasting to such a young child. My first reaction was to explain to him that fasting is to not eat in order to dedicate time to prayer and the study of the Word. The boy answered me and said. "Pastor, that will be very difficult for me, I don't have anything to eat to begin with and when I do have food, it is once a day. So what this means is that all I am lacking in is to pray, and you can read the Bible to me because I have never been able to go to school!" As you can imagine my heart was saddened and I could not help but cry. This reinforced the need to open the Center for Childhood Nutrition as soon as possible, and the need for us to continue to support the community with scholarships for school. Continue praying and supporting these ministries and thank you for your faithfulness so far.

In the Maternal Clinic we have six new babies. Glory to God! And for those of you who have had the privilege to visit us here in Honduras you know that our car has served as ambulance, public transportation (carrying more than 40 people each Tuesday back to their homes after the Bible studies in Balibrea and surrounding villages) we have also used it to help with childbirth, etc. That car has many stories to tell! It is also our personal vehicle. Well, unfortunately the motor of the car is ruined! We ask for your prayers that God would provide for the repairs to the car.

I have several prayer requests:

- Pray for each ministry in Balibrea
- Pray for our safety
- Pray God would provide so we are able to pay for our children's education
- Pray God would provide new transposition since the motor of our vehicle is ruined
