Someday, there will be permanent Christmas

With great sadness, we want to share with you that Juanita Rocha, Dorys' mom, passed away several days ago. Two years ago, Alan's dad went to Heaven as well. How could we celebrate? Although we recognize the difficulty of these times, we have the certainty that someday the Lord will turn these circumstances into a permanent celebration of His unmatched love and the Incarnation of His Son and His complete triumph.

1. The reality of a fallen world. The Bible says that we live under abnormal conditions, and that the Almighty mysteriously decides to live with the consequences of evil and sin. A description of the current conditions of the universe does not seem to leave much room for optimism. Apart from the daily experience, the Bible affirms with overwhelming realism, not only that creation is subject to frustration (Rom 8:20, "futility"), but even acknowledges that "the whole world lies in the power of the evil one" (1 John 5:19). These conditions include sin, failure and also the death of our loved ones. However, although this is the reality in which we are all immersed, it is not the ultimate reality; it is a passing illusion.


2. The intervention of God. It is true that the Bible is more than realistic when it comes to describing the sad conditions of the world. However, it also says clearly that the Lord does not have an indifferent attitude towards it. In fact, almost the same passages in which the failure of the present world is declared, it affirms that the Lord is on the way to restitute what has been broken by sin and death. Romans 8 mentions "futility", "suffering", "bondage" or "decay"; but also declares "hope" and "the freedom of the glory of the children of God". Jesus rightly refers to His Second Coming as a "new world" (literally a "regeneration of all things"). You see? Soon the Lord will put things in their place! Sin, death and injustice should have no place in the world ... And they will not have it! There will be like a permanent Christmas!

3. Our place in God's strategic plan. The children of God are part of the Lord's plan of action to fulfill that purpose. Today it is up to us to model and announce the "normal" conditions for the world. Instead of injustice, we live and preach righteousness; Instead of selfishness, we proclaim generosity; Instead of death we announce and promote life; Instead of hate, we value selfless love. What a privilege! Begin to see what happens around you as a huge and sad parenthesis; as a dreadful pause that will soon be left behind by the Lord of the Universe. At the same time, become an agent of that alternative reality and promote the higher values of the One who sent His son to give us hope that someday we will return to normal; to a permanent Christmas state. Glory to His name!

The hands of a servant

Take a look to the picture on the right. It is a picture of the hands of one of our MBI students in the small village of El Carreto, Honduras. As you can see, these hands know about working the generous land. The are experienced in life and they know about sacrifice to sustain a family. 2. Pray for economic provision for both teachers and students. Most pastors must have a second job to live. One of our students received just around 8 dollars to attend the classes. However, he was more than happy to come.
