#### Still waiting for Jayden's legal abandonment to be finalized

I'm starting to get frustrated with the adoption process. At the beginning of 2016 I was pretty sure that the adoption would be finished before the year's end. Now, it's obvious that it won't be. In June and July we made leaps forward. But since then the process has been stagnant due to ridiculous oversight and negligence. At some point someone in the process decided that Jayden's age had to be verified. He was evaluated by a court appointed doctor and a report was sent. Three weeks went by without a response. Discouraged, I communicated with my lawyer to see if there were calls to be made or strings to be pulled. We were both perplexed as to why his age needed to be verified since he had a birth certificate. My lawyer called one of her contacts in Honduran Child Services. They were unaware that there was a birth certificate. That made no sense. It's in his case file. They HAVE his case file! Nevertheless, I had to hand deliver an official copy of his birth certificate to the regional office of Honduran Child Services.

Recently, the seemly simple procedure of generating and sending copies of two legal documents from the capitol city to the court in Siguatepeque took more than a month. But finally, all the necessary documentation is in the courthouse in Siguatepeque awaiting for the court to act. Frustrating!

Thank you for your continued prayers and encouragement during all these years. You are a real blessing.

**Marissa** is struggling in her classes, but by and large is encouraged. Her areas of weakness from the past year are creating certain challenges. Please pray specifically for improvement in her understanding of and the correct pronunciation in both Spanish and English. Currently, I am looking for a good tutor that will help her advance in Spanish.

I continue to invest some of my time in the teachers and students of a local Spanish institute. It has proven to be rather rewarding. This month I spent 3 days meeting with each of the students. They are new missionaries in different stages of their lives and in their adjustment to life outside of the States.
