The Tabernacle & the Tent Peg

Sweet morsel from God's Word— Many people shy away from reading the Old Testament; too dry, too boring, can't understand what it means. To that I would say a resounding, **NOT SO!** Recently I was reading in the book of Exodus about the description and instructions God provided for building the tabernacle; what was in essence a portable place of worship. I imaging that most people skip over this part of the Exodus story. After all, it's hard to top the burning bush, plagues in Egypt, and crossing the Red Sea. Let me say that to do so is to miss out on some of the most encouraging imagery in the Bible.

God describes in great detail the parts of the tabernacle, what each part is to be made from, what the assembled tabernacle is to look like and also the elaborate raiment the priests are to wear. As I looked at the lists of the parts of the tabernacle and

garments, you see words like "pure gold", "silver", "fine twined linen", "skillfully worked", "finest spices", "glory", "beauty", "sapphire", "diamond" and "finely wrought" in referring to these parts. When assembled, the tabernacle would provide a place for God's glory to reside with this fledgling nation. Then I saw it; near the end of the list, without embellishment... tent pegs. The humble tent peg— its sole purpose was to be driven into the ground and be pulled on by the tent cords. There it



was, the lowly tent peg listed among the noble parts—the ark, the mercy seat, the veil, the alter, the jewels, etc.

So, what is the take-away? Simply this—in God's work, everything is important. Without the tent pegs, the tabernacle would not have stood, rendering the role of the priests, even in all their magnificent raiment, useless.

Then what is the application you say? In the cause of Christ, have you ever felt like a tent peg... pounded into the ground, out of sight, and constantly pulled on? **Rejoice**, your service to our Lord is vital! For a New Testament echo of this Old Testament principle look at I Corinthians 12:12-26.
