People were so happy, especially the people needing extractions. Well... in the moment of having their teeth pulled out they may not have been so happy! There were two specific stories that filled me with joy.



One young man had two days without working the land and had abandoned his crops because of the pain in his mouth. He couldn't even sleep. He insisted that they pull the tooth but the doctor kept telling him they could rescue the tooth. He was so young the doctor did not want him to lose a tooth. After much discussion they were able to keep the tooth. The young man cried like a baby and thanked God for His mercy.







An older gentleman, about 70 years old had a double row of teeth and no local dentists wanted to touch it. The dentists told him it was not worth it because he was so old and about to die. Why even try? What a change in his smile when the doctors pulled the extra teeth. What a blessing to serve in that way!!

Love is shown, lived out. And that is what we saw that week with the team of dentists. They were so professional and filled with such love. The people of Familia de La Fe that served alongside the team were so blessed to experience this new kind of ministry. Glory to God. We share the love of God to all people.
