We received from a friend a generous donation of clothes, shoes and toys. We delivered these items to the hands of those who needed them most. Some of them were students and teachers of the Bible Seminary, pastors, and also a ministry that works with children of high risk.

We were able to obtain through Samaritan's Purse 150 evangelistic resources. We were able to hand these out among four communities in the neighboring communities of Siguatepeque. 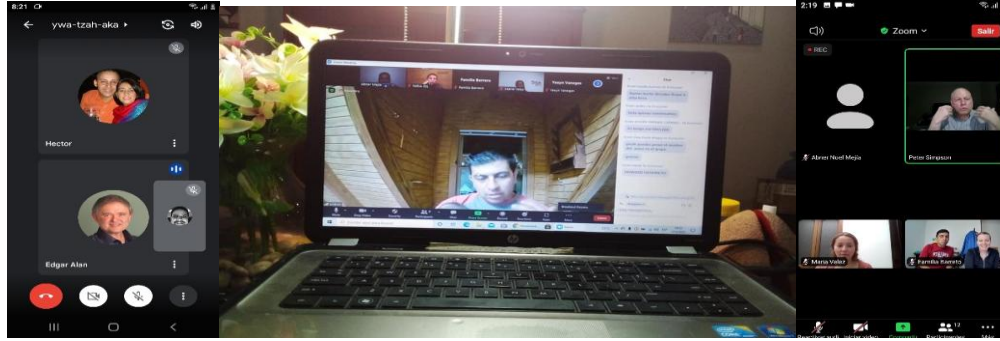


**Doña Maribel's House...**

Abner works alongside a Board of Directors of Estéreo VECA, a radio ministry of the Central American Church in Comayagua. He will also be able to “re-start” his radio program “Know your Faith”.
