Dear Partner of our Kenya Orphanage,

Our children are doing well and will complete the 3rd term of the Kenyan school year in early March, with four children expected to complete primary school. Once final scores are received, Director David Magiri will determine where to enroll each in secondary boarding school (high school). Two children are expected to graduate from secondary school. Their scores will determine if and which university or college they may be able to attend. Students not scoring well enough or unable to pay for university or college often go to a trade school.





We are thankful for the faithful support of our donors who enable World Reach to cover the costs for our children's primary and secondary education, uniforms, boarding fees, etc. After secondary school graduation, we will be able to bring two new children into our home to replace the graduates. Please pray for Director David Magiri as he and his wife, Janet, help our two graduates make important decisions about their future and also as two new children are introduced to our home.

A Letter From David Magiri

Dear Friends of World Reach Orphanage,

Please find the story of the impact of the World Reach Orphanage on the life of Ronny Kiogora. As a child, Ronny was abandoned by his parents and left with his grandmother who could not afford to take him to school or to feed, shelter, or clothe him. After Ronny came to the orphanage, World Reach started taking Ronny to school. He received food, clothes, and shelter and moreover, was taught the Word of God.

After Ronny completed his primary education and finished his secondary education, he stayed at my home for a number of months. Janet and I supported Ronny and sent him to a cooking school for 2 years. After he finished his training in cooking school, he developed an interest in working for our orphanage. I started giving him part-time work in relieving the guard on campus, substituting for house mothers, and doing other work around the campus such as cleaning and other chores. After a few months, Ronny submitted an application seeking an opportunity to work as a full-time staff member. Now Ronny is happy to be an employee of World Reach. This is a living testimony in what God is doing through World Reach Ministry teaching and changing the lives of childrent.


