Physical and spiritual relief

I have the privilege to serve about 10 communities in the western part of the country, alongside some local churches in the area and health providers. Together with local school directors, we identify the needs of the people, looking for solutions to help and show them the love of Christ. I also have the opportunity to preach the Gospel through serving others. These have been intense times serving pastors and their families, spiritually and physically. I have preached in their churches and also provided clothes and some gifts that are useful to them in their homes. We have also had some



celebrations directed towards families, especially children. There are so many children! It is exciting that

people are beginning to come to church as a result of the activities. Glory be to God.

Professional soccer here in the country, which has always been a joy for Salvadorans, is in a moment of crisis. There is much bickering between the federation and the government. There are no tournaments in some of the leagues, and FIFA is about to sanction us. The soccer players have not received their salaries and they train with very little hope of playing. In the middle of all this, I had the opportunity to attend a practice of the professional team of my city. I shared Jesus with them. It was an incredible opportunity to take the Word of God and see how their hearts were receptive and



open in the middle of this crisis. God brings about opportunities to preach in every avenue. I hope to continue to have the opportunity to preach to this group of men who have such a need for Christ.

After speaking with the leaders at Stones Crossing Church, we decided that they should come to El Salvador on January 21-28 of 2023. They have not been to El Salvador since before the pandemic. We are excited to continue our charge of the great commission through the visit of this medical team. This will be a great time of blessing for all involved, especially the communities that we will be attending to. There is such a great need. The logistical planning has begun, and I ask for your prayers for direction, wisdom, and that God would provide all that we need for that week.
