How is the family?



We thank God for his faithfulness in our lives. Alisson has remained stable, although discomforts from her thyroid condition have appeared at the least expected times. She spends a lot of time with the children and at home, but that doesn't stop her from serving the Lord through the ministries that God has given her. Ian Andrés is in fourth grade at ABEKA, and he enjoys school very much. This year, he has more exams and usually he gets the best grades in his class.



Ellie Sophia is 7 months old and is very active. She often wakes up several times at night, but she has brought us great joy. Abner has been suffering some ailments in his physical health. Several lab tests show some potential problems, but by the grace

of God, he is receiving medical treatment and is gradually changing his eating habits.

How is the ministry going?

Alisson has been seeing some patients at the clinic. A very sad recent case is that of Daniel. He is a boy who attends our church, and Abner noticed that one of his front teeth was fractured. We invited him to receive free treatment for it at our dental clinic. We met his mother who told us that she and her husband were thinking of moving to the United States without documents. Daniel was very sad. We realized that his tooth pain didn't compare with the painful fact that his parents might be leaving Honduras without him, leaving him and his two brothers in the care of an aunt. We encouraged Daniel's mother to keep up the struggle here in Honduras, and we invited her and the family to our church. We hope that we can have more contact with them.

We continue to work on the Library. We've been buying more books and putting up more shelves. We are planning a program during school vacation so that the children who finish school in November can come and keep working on their reading and can listen to Bible stories. We plan to continue this ministry of service and outreach to the community.

Abner continues to serve in various ministries in and outside the local church. He recently taught the class: "The Leader and His Life in Christ as a Model for Children" at the Central American Biblical Seminary. Many Sunday school teachers from local churches attended.

Abner is also leading several remodeling projects on the buildings of the Christian Family Center Church. One of these small buildings will serve to house our worship leader along with his wife and daughter. He will be in charge of musical instruction in the church and will be responsible for coordinating a Music Academy that will serve the community also.
