It was moving to see Chris come in front of everybody and say key Bible verses along with his classmates. On behalf of the congregation, two adults expressed the appreciation and love for the children. #### Multiple Teaching in Nicaragua

well to teach in other cities. As a result, we spent almost two weeks traveling to three cities in Nicaragua and teaching in different events. Praise the Lord!

First of all, we attended the Youth Camp. There were some 90 enthusiastic and energetic youths. Kristian, our son, served as a leader of one of the tribes of the camp. Alan taught 6 times about "A Different Kind of War" about the spiritual battle. Several kids expressed their gratitude. Some even said to Alan: "You are a different kind of preacher: you connect with us and our reality". Praise the Lord.

The second place was Presillas, Dorys' birthplace. The Church which sent her to study the Bible asked Alan, Dorys and Kristian to teach to all the leaders of the Church. Alan taught about character and motivations to the elders and deacons. Dorvs taught about education to Sunday School teachers, and Kristan taught about strategic planning. It was an emotional experience, specially for Dorys, who reconnected with brothers and sisters from her birth town. Her dad came along and enjoyed a time with us and with the Church.

some 100 pastors heard the exposition of the Word of God by Alan. He spoke about several realities of ministry such as "Convenience Versus Faithfulness" and "How to face Temptation and Failure". The pastors even asked some hard questions. It was a time of reflection and self analysis. The Lord



spoke clearly to the life and ministry of everybody.
