I hope that as you receive our first letter of 2025, you are full of the joy of the Lord. We are thankful to those who we were able to visit this past year when we were in the States. Your kindness towards us was spectacular. May God bless you!





It is exciting to write to you and share about the growing work God is doing. He continues to open doors of opportunity to take the Gospel to different places in a variety of ways. We had barely been back from our trip to the States, and we made ourselves available to the local churches. We were able to meet with a new group of people that Pastor Yovany from Balibrea Church has formed. There is the hope that soon it may become a new church plant.

I was invited to preach for a New Year's Eve service at one of the homes. It was a small home of a poor family and to my surprise, those invited were so many that they did not fit inside the home. This is a new group of believers from an area called "Las Cien Manzanas" ("One Hundred Apples"). They are already growing in size and in their knowledge of God. Per the usual, many of the group are single women, abandoned and left with their children. These women have fought to raise and support their families.

I ask you to join me in praying for this new area where the Gospel is being preached.

We celebrated a beautiful End of Year service at our local church, CFC. God gave me the privilege of preaching, and we had a baby dedication for my third grandchild, Harol David Fonseca. It was a time of gratitude and prayer on this last service of the year. We ended the service by thanking God for the past year and giving Him the start of the new year.

Immediately, on January 2nd, we began work in the mountains where God allowed us to work for 4 days, organizing and training the leaders. We were all preparing for the arrival of a medical team from Birmingham, Alabama. During those four days, we were able to finish the bathrooms of the church at El Duraznal in preparation for the medical brigade.





The medical team had a delay in their arrival to Honduras, which caused us to lose one day in the mountains. Even so, we drove up the mountain and God gave us excellent weather as we had the first medical clinic in this Lencan region of Honduras. I ask you to pray with me that this will not be the last time we take doctors to this area, rather the first of many.

For God's glory many people gave their lives to Jesus.
