Muthetheni, Kenya

Our World Reach staff in Muthetheni assembled a large team of volunteers to assist us in our first 2-day medical outreach. We did not know the government healthcare system would be on strike when this event was planned. This resulted in over 1200 patients from 3 counties in eastern Kenya attending! Eight doctors, including Dr. Smith, a World Reach Board Member, were quite busy. The gospel was preached to the waiting crowd of patients and people assisting them. Over 2000 clearly heard the gospel. Several patients received Christ and some requested counseling by our clinic pastor. By the end of the first day, we were low on medicine, and I had to travel about 45 minutes to buy more. We tried to return to our center late in the evening, but a downpour caused a flood that prevented our river crossing! Thank God the rains held off during most of our outreach, as the country was experiencing heavy rain and flooding.


Meru, Kenya

In Meru, I met with my team and our children to assess their needs for the future. Then I was able to meet with a contractor to start a plan for the future projects.

I was moved by the attitude of our team and children. The children have blossomed under the new leadership team. Attitudes have been transformed, and they are energized to excel in school. We have six attending vocational school in Meru. Two new young children have been added. Three in the picture desire to be doctors and nurses. Two want to become engineers. Several want to be sent out as missionaries. The children are excited about the future construction impacting their lives, and I am excited to see the gospel impacting their lives. Faith, hope, and love are evident.

Honduras

I will leave Thursday, June 20, to meet with our team in Honduras and visit the site of our church planting effort among the Lenca indigenous people in the mountains near Siguatepeque. Two men from Shades Mountain Community Church are visiting to see the church planting effort too. We hope to construct several more churches in the remote area that will serve the Lencas. Currently, people have to walk several hours to attend a church service at the one small church already there. Our team is training the future pastors who will lead the churches.

For the last several weeks, I have been leading a weekly Scripture-focused prayer time with our Colombian team and the Birmingham, Alabama team. I am amazed and thankful that God revealed truth and changed hearts during these times. Paul prayed in Ephesians 1:17 that God would give us a spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him. I can attest that focused listening to God in His word is powerful.
