Miss Yissel has returned to La Roca to meet our needs at the elementary level. I say returned because she taught with us for years before teaching at another school in 2024 and 2025.







This week we have had a medical team visiting from Providence Church in Raleigh, NC. This team of doctors and nurses worked on campus each morning providing Well child check-ups to our student body. The children had hemoglobin checks, vision screening, were seen by a doctor and received vitamins. In the afternoon the team provided medical attention in a surrounding neighborhood. Thursday and Friday they are working in the community of Quilmana, two-hours south of Lima where the church would like to start a church plant. Please pray that the people they attend would not only receive the medical care they seek, but more importantly their heart's would be receptive to the message of salvation from eternal condemnation that only comes through Jesus.







On Wednesday, we had our ceremony at school for the installation of the school police and other brigades. Ethan was chosen to be the leader of his class for the year. Micah was chosen for the First-aid brigade. And I am the leader of the Security and Protection brigade, making sure everyone is accounted for in the case of an emergency. Because we live on the Pacific coast our number one natural disaster is earthquakes. We pray we will never have a serious earthquake during school hours but we have drills to prepare for this scenario.

Thursday and Friday are national holidays here in Peru for Holy Week. While the Catholic church puts their focus on Thursday and Friday, we thank the Lord that the story didn't end with Christ's death but instead we celebrate his victory over the grave, and the hope that we have because He has risen! He is alive! Though it is a time to reflect and remember, we will also celebrate on Sunday that because of Jesus, all who believe in Him have eternal life!
