One of the gifts God has given me is the ability to connect people, churches, and organizations for the development of ministry. Over time, God has also been working deeply in my heart. He has brought healing and helped me overcome the mistaken idea that we should only work for “our own kingdom.” The Lord has reminded me of a simple but powerful truth: **the Kingdom belongs to Him**. We have simply been invited, by His grace and mercy, to participate in His work as



servants. Because of this, when someone - even a complete stranger - calls me to talk about a project that seeks to bless others, I rarely hesitate to offer my help in whatever way I can. I have learned that many of the things God wants to do begin simply with a conversation, a connection, or a willing heart.

In February, those blessed connections allowed us to serve together with three other ministries. During one week, we witnessed God's grace in very tangible ways: more than 1,400 people were served through medical, dental, and eye care. Alisson attended to many patients and had the opportunity to share the Gospel of God's grace with them. For my part, I was able to preach the Gospel, speak with many people, and help with different logistical aspects of the outreach. It is a blessing to connect people in order to help others. It is a blessing to connect resources, talents, and ministries to glorify God, to strengthen His people, and to reach those who do not yet know Jesus Christ personally. This leads to a couple of important questions for each of us to consider. First, what connections is God calling you to make in order to bless others? Second, what barriers might you need to overcome to obey that calling? Let us never forget that God's work is not about us; it is about God and the extraordinary things He can do through ordinary people, like you and me.

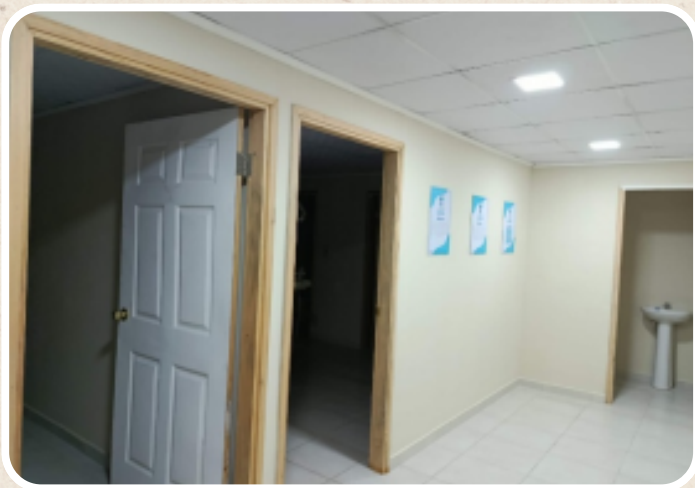

MORE PROJECTS FOR THE KINGDOM OF GOD:

COMMUNITY DENTAL CLINIC IN PASO HONDO

As some of you already know, we have been working for several years on the community dental clinic project in Paso Hondo, a developing neighborhood where we have been serving for the past four years. Recently, we completed all the preparation for the physical space. God has provided the funds needed for the dental equipment, and we expect to purchase it soon. However, we still need to install a water storage tank and a metal structure to support it. In Siguatepeque, we do not have a constant water supply, so water tanks are essential to store water. This clinic will be a great blessing for the 120 children at the local public school and at least five surrounding communities that have very limited access to dental care.



VOCATIONAL TRAINING SCHOOL

We are about to begin a new initiative that has been a dream in our hearts for some time. The goal is to help 5th and 6th grade students from the public school. Many of these students are unable to continue their education after finishing 6th grade and must begin working to help support their families. Because of this reality, we want to provide them with practical skills that can open doors for their future. We plan to offer two training courses: 1) basic residential electrical work and 2) baking and pastry-making. To start these courses, we need funds to purchase electrical supplies for hands-on training, as well as a couple of mixers and ovens for the baking course. We believe these skills can create meaningful opportunities for these young people who face very difficult realities at such a young age.

WOMEN'S CONFERENCE



Lord willing, this will be the third year that we organize a women's conference in the region. In previous years, between 300 and 400 women have attended. God has used our friend Reyna Anderson from Kentucky in a powerful way as a speaker and in helping raise funds to make the conference possible. This year we are exploring a new strategy to continue hosting this conference and to keep strengthening and encouraging the lives of women in Honduras.

TRAINING LEADERS AND PASTORS

God has entrusted Abner with the leadership of the Mobile Bible Institutes of Central America and the Caribbean. Currently, more than 120 pastors and key leaders are being trained through the leadership development initiatives of World Reach. God is also opening new doors for pastor and leadership training in the Dominican Republic. Healthy and well-trained pastors and leaders are essential for building strong churches that are grounded in the Word of God.
